Scripture Reading 1

Job 38:1-33

38:1 Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind:

- ² "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge?
 ³ Gird up your loins like a man,
 I will question you, and you shall declare to me.
- ⁴ "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth?

 Tell me, if you have understanding.
 - 5 Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it?
 - ⁶ On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone
 - 7 when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings^[a] shouted for joy?
- 8 "Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb?—
 - 9 when I made the clouds its garment, and thick darkness its swaddling band,
 - ¹⁰ and prescribed bounds for it, and set bars and doors,
 - 11 and said, 'Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stopped'?
- 12 "Have you commanded the morning since your days began, and caused the dawn to know its place,
 - 13 so that it might take hold of the skirts of the earth, and the wicked be shaken out of it?
 - 14 It is changed like clay under the seal,

and it is dyed[b] like a garment.

15 Light is withheld from the wicked, and their uplifted arm is broken.

16 "Have you entered into the springs of the sea, or walked in the recesses of the deep?

- ¹⁷ Have the gates of death been revealed to you, or have you seen the gates of deep darkness?
- 18 Have you comprehended the expanse of the earth? Declare, if you know all this.
- 19 "Where is the way to the dwelling of light, and where is the place of darkness,
 - ²⁰ that you may take it to its territory and that you may discern the paths to its home?
 - ²¹ Surely you know, for you were born then, and the number of your days is great!
- ²² "Have you entered the storehouses of the snow, or have you seen the storehouses of the hail,
 - ²³ which I have reserved for the time of trouble, for the day of battle and war?
 - ²⁴ What is the way to the place where the light is distributed, or where the east wind is scattered upon the earth?
- 25 "Who has cut a channel for the torrents of rain, and a way for the thunderbolt,
 - ²⁶ to bring rain on a land where no one lives, on the desert, which is empty of human life,
 - ²⁷ to satisfy the waste and desolate land, and to make the ground put forth grass?
- ²⁸ "Has the rain a father,

or who has begotten the drops of dew?

- ²⁹ From whose womb did the ice come forth, and who has given birth to the hoarfrost of heaven?
- ³⁰ The waters become hard like stone, and the face of the deep is frozen.
- 31 "Can you bind the chains of the Pleiades, or loose the cords of Orion?
 - ³² Can you lead forth the Mazzaroth in their season, or can you guide the Bear with its children?
 - 33 Do you know the ordinances of the heavens? Can you establish their rule on the earth?
